

'Life's short. Get a divorce' billboard removed

CHICAGO (AP) — A racy billboard proclaiming "Life's short. Get a divorce" caused such an uproar that city workers stripped it from its downtown perch after a week.

It wasn't so much about the partially clothed man, and woman on the law firm's ad. It was the phrase that lawyers Cor-

ri Fetman and Kelly Garland chose that drew scores of complaints from neighbors and from other attorneys who said it reflected poorly on their profession. Despite its brief run, the sign apparently was good for business. Since it went up last week, the two attorneys said calls to their firm have gone up.
